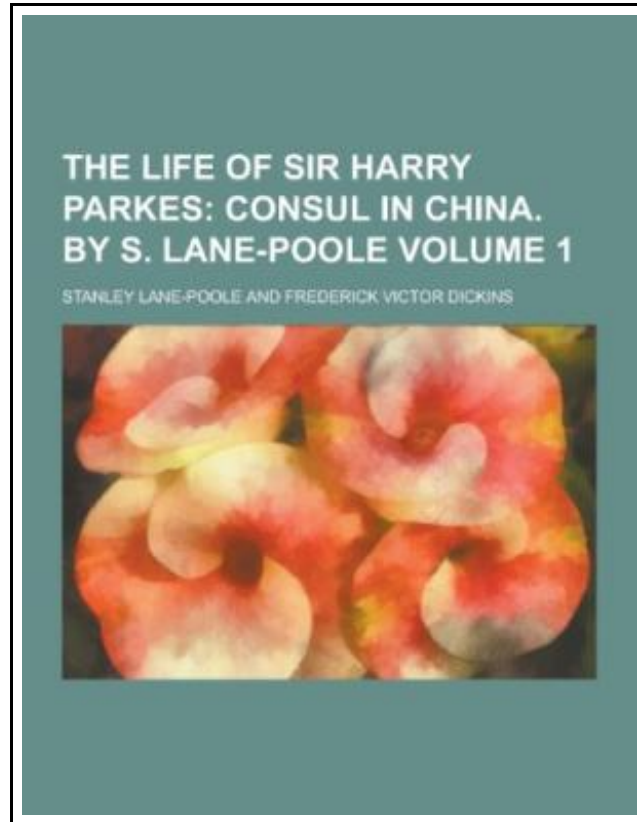

Indeed he wanted to be off the moment the Treaty was signed: to have done so, as Parkes wrote (28th October), would have been to have...
